Diplomat's removals	<ul> <li>Certificate from Embassy or Consulate.</li> <li>Original French inventory, detailed, valorised, dated and signed by the owner.</li> </ul>	Duty free entry if the document for free entry is signed by the Foreign Ministry.	For diplomatic air/sea shipments, origin agent must send as soon as possible all original documents to the destination agent. It takes 21 days to obtain the document for free entry from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and customs head office.
New Furniture and Household Goods	<ul> <li>Commercial invoice.</li> <li>Packing list.</li> <li>Copy of Ocean/Airway Bill of Lading.</li> </ul>	Subject to customs duty and tax.	Clearance: 7 days.
Motor vehicles	<ul> <li>Commercial invoice.</li> <li>Packing list.</li> <li>Copy of Ocean/Airway Bill of Lading.</li> <li>Original invoice for the freight.</li> </ul>	Subject to customs duty and tax	Second hand cars have to be controlled by "SGS" prior to importation.
Alcoholic beverages		Prohibited and should be sent separately. Only the mention "fond de cave" (less than 30 bottles) is acceptable.
